Introduction

Women's Aid is the lead voluntary organisation in Northern Ireland addressing domestic violence against women and children recognising it as one form of violence against women. The overall aim of Women's Aid is to eliminate domestic violence and to challenge the attitudes and beliefs that perpetuate it.

The publication of this directory of Women's Aid services in Northern Ireland comes at a key point in the promotion of strategies to address and overcome domestic violence in our society. When Women's Aid first developed services 30 years ago, there was little understanding of the needs of women and children experiencing physical and emotional abuse and very few services responding to their needs.

Today Women's Aid is pleased to acknowledge how many things have changed: domestic violence is now recognised as a crime, it forms part of a policy agenda across government; and is the focus of much inter agency co-operation between key statutory agencies and voluntary organisations. There is now greater public awareness of the issue and many agencies have developed their roles and responses. But many challenges still face us all in tackling domestic violence and abuse.

This directory reflects the importance of Women's Aid as the lead agency responding to domestic violence and the most significant provider of support services to women and children. A key aim of the directory is to provide clear, accurate information to enable better access to vital, specialist services for women and children.

What is domestic violence?

Domestic violence is the intentional and persistent physical, emotional or sexual abuse of a woman, or of a woman and her children in a way that causes pain, distress or injury. Domestic violence is rarely a one-off event: it tends to escalate in frequency and severity over time. Domestic violence is a common occurrence. Research shows that it can affect as many as one in four women in their lifetimes, regardless of age, social class, ethnicity, disability or lifestyle.

There are several forms of domestic violence and all of them – psychological, economic, sexual, emotional and physical – are the result of abusers' misuse of power and control.

Everyone has the right to live free from violence and fear. Because of the nature and impact of persistent physical and emotional abuse, getting free can be a lengthy and difficult process. Women may be ashamed and fearful about disclosing their abusive experiences. The first response to a woman is vital. She must be met with empathy and sensitivity. Every opportunity should be used to ensure she knows what support is available and how to access it.

How to use this directory

For more detailed information please access the Women's Aid Federation Northern Ireland website on www.womensaidni.org or participate in a training event run by Women's Aid which will increase your knowledge and understanding of the extent, nature and impact of domestic violence.

Ten local Women's Aid groups are all members of Women's Aid Federation Northern Ireland. They deliver a range of specialised support services to women and children who have experienced domestic violence.

The directory contains details of the services provided by Women's Aid throughout Northern Ireland. It begins with an alphabetical list which describes the range of Women's Aid services. This is followed by a profile of each local Women's Aid group and a checklist of those services provided by them.

The term *Women's Aid* is used in this document to reflect the overall Women's Aid movement in Northern Ireland which is made up of local Women's Aid groups and the Women's Aid Federation.

The information in this directory was accurate at the time of publication, but services without core funding may be subject to withdrawal or change. It is our intention to reissue this directory regularly to reflect new and changing services.

While every effort has been made to reflect all Women's Aid services in this directory, the list is not exhaustive. There may be variations or additional services provided locally. Please contact your local Women's Aid group for full details.

Accommodation: refuges	<p>Women's Aid refuges provide safe emergency accommodation to women and children experiencing domestic violence. Refuges cater for women and for women with children. Length of stay depends on each woman's needs and those of her children. Many women stay in refuges more than once as part of the process of ending a relationship with an abusive partner. Refuge addresses are kept confidential to protect women's safety. Women choose whether they wish to stay in a refuge close to their home or at one elsewhere.</p> <p>The 24 Hour Domestic Violence Helpline (0800 917 1414) or local Women's Aid services can help find suitable refuge accommodation to meet specific needs such as location, size of room, accessibility, children's special requirements, cultural needs etc.</p>
Accommodation: move-on	<p>Move-on houses are a temporary option for women and children who are preparing to move on from living in refuge.</p>
Advice	<p>Women's Aid advice service provides information and advice to women on legal, welfare, housing and money matters. The service provides representation at appeal tribunals. Advice is delivered by qualified personnel; the service being a member of Advice NI.</p>
Advocacy and support	<p>Women's Aid provides support for women and children while advocating on their behalf with other agencies. Emotional and practical support is offered with legal, welfare, housing and money matters and making safe arrangements for children.</p>
Aftercare and resettlement	<p>Women's Aid provides support for women and children leaving the refuge in the form of resettlement and aftercare services. Women are assisted in moving and settling into new homes; and aftercare provides ongoing support and also enables women to support one another.</p>
Children and young people	<p>Women's Aid provides special services and support for children and young people in refuges as well as other settings. This support is delivered through personal development programmes and play activities on an individual and groupwork basis. Women's Aid helps mothers with practical arrangements such as finding a new school or nursery and by providing crèche and respite care to allow women to attend appointments.</p>
Community resource centres	<p>Women's Aid provides support and information through its community based resource centres. Emotional and practical support is offered with legal, welfare, housing and money matters and with making safe arrangements for children. Some Women's Aid groups offer one to one support that includes counselling.</p>

Helpline	<p>The 24 Hour Domestic Violence Helpline (0800 917 1414) offers:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Support and crisis intervention for abused women - Information and signposting to agencies - Referral to Women's Aid services <p>The Helpline assists women to identify their options and to make informed decisions and choices.</p> <p>The Helpline is open to anyone affected by domestic violence and is staffed by experienced and trained women.</p> <p>A translating service is available for callers who do not speak English as a first language and minicom for those with hearing difficulties.</p>
Information	<p>Information services include the design and maintenance of the website; production and design of all printed material including cards, leaflets and reports; publication of translated leaflets for women who do not speak English as a first language; public relations and media work; monthly information bulletins; maintaining a library of reference materials and any other work that pertains to raising awareness of domestic violence.</p>
Inter-agency work and policy development	<p>Women's Aid is committed to working co-operatively with agencies and organisations to achieve effective policy and best practice. Health, housing and social services, the civil and criminal justice system are all areas where partnership and interagency work are established. Links with churches, trade unions, voluntary and community groups are also well developed. Women's Aid plays a lead role in all local domestic violence fora across Northern Ireland and in the Regional Steering Group.</p>
Justice support	<p>Women's Aid supports women through civil and criminal legal proceedings. This includes briefings on what to expect at a court hearing, meeting with court personnel before the day of a hearing and accompanying women to court, solicitors, barristers etc.</p> <p>Some courthouses provide waiting facilities for women being supported by Women's Aid.</p>
Outreach and floating support	<p>Women's Aid has developed domestic violence Outreach and Floating Support services to provide practical and emotional help to women not staying in a refuge.</p> <p>Outreach is provided in local communities, in rural areas and to women from minority ethnic communities.</p> <p>Floating Support is a specific outreach service for women who wish to remain in their own home: it is provided to women who do not need to use refuges, as well as to women in temporary accommodation like B&Bs or hostels where no support or help on domestic violence is available.</p>

Perpetrator programme support	Women's Aid provides support to women whose partners or ex-partners are attending the Probation Board's <i>Men Overcoming Domestic Violence</i> (MoDV) programme. This programme, run in several areas of Northern Ireland, is for men who have been mandated by the courts to attend or who have been referred on a voluntary basis eg via social services. One key aim of the programme is to protect victims of domestic violence.
Personal development	Women's Aid provides opportunities for personal development through training and education programmes. Subjects include: promoting self esteem; positive parenting; communication skills; assertiveness; health and well being including domestic violence. Women's Aid also offers pre-vocational programmes such as computer skills, first aid and effective helping skills.
Preventative work in education	Women's Aid provides specialist training for individuals and agencies working with or on behalf of children. This work promotes effective protection and prevention strategies for young people affected by domestic violence. Education and activity packs are available for children and young people entitled <i>Helping Hands</i> and <i>No Fear</i> . Women's Aid's video <i>Hurting, Coping, Growing - children and domestic violence</i> provides organisations with a useful training tool.
Research, resources and publications	Women's Aid commissions and disseminates research on aspects of domestic violence to promote policy development and increased awareness. A wide range of materials is available on domestic violence and the work of Women's Aid. Materials for use throughout Northern Ireland can be viewed at www.womensaidni.org . Materials on specific locations can be accessed through local Women's Aid groups.
Training and education: external	Women's Aid increases awareness of domestic violence through its specialist training delivered to a wide range of community, voluntary and statutory organisations. These include women's groups, support organisations, employers, inter-agency partnerships, statutory agencies, schools, colleges and universities. Courses range from introductory sessions to specialised areas relating to children or minority groups. Tailored training courses are available for specific needs.
Training and education: internal	Women's Aid provides all staff with mandatory induction training on domestic violence and effective responses. Opportunities for further training, education, personal and professional development are offered on an ongoing basis both within Women's Aid and from other sources.
Vounteering	Women's Aid offers a wide range of opportunities for volunteers, including student placements. Places are available in many aspects of Women's Aid's work and volunteers are supported by training and supervision.
